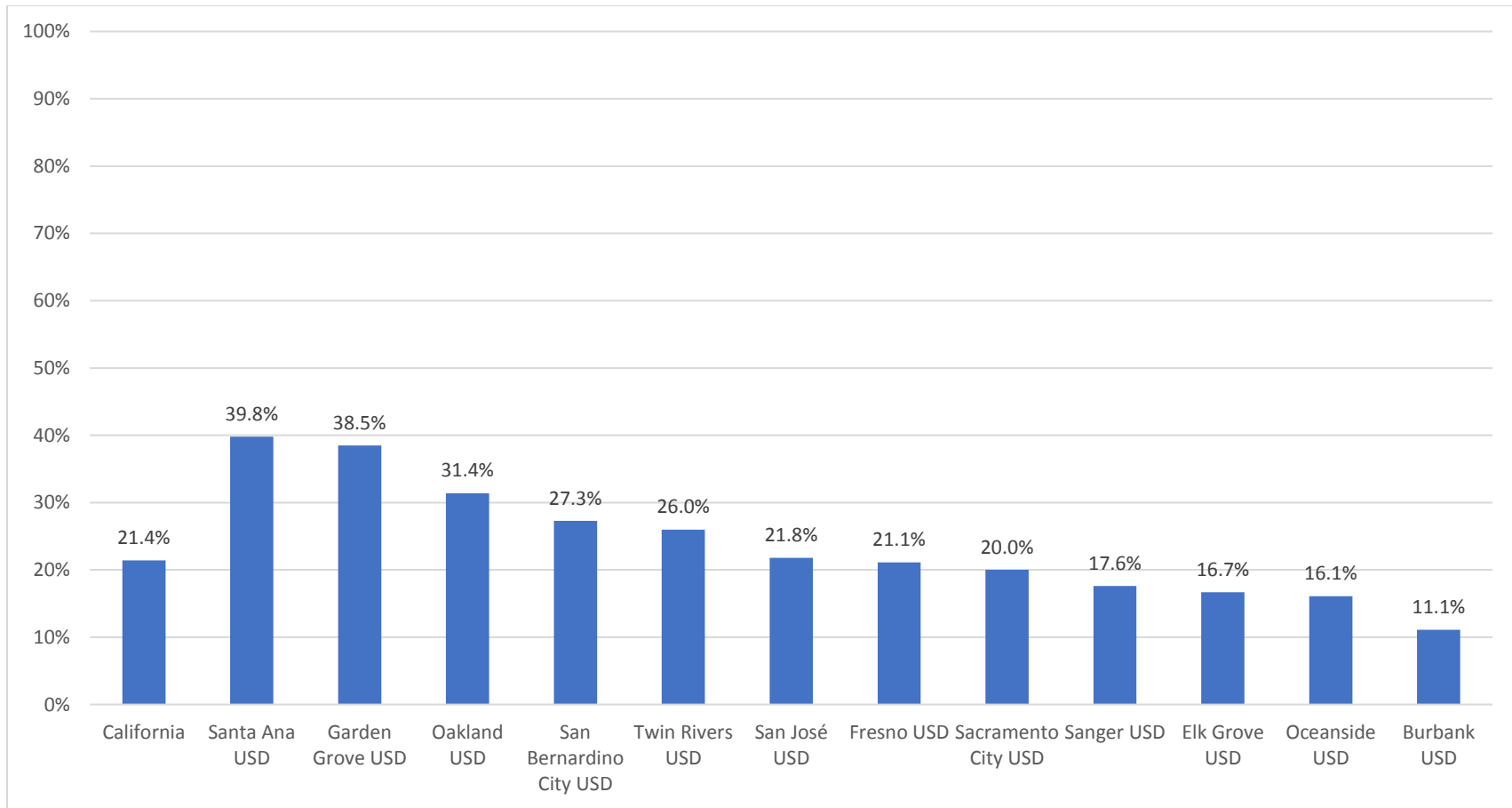

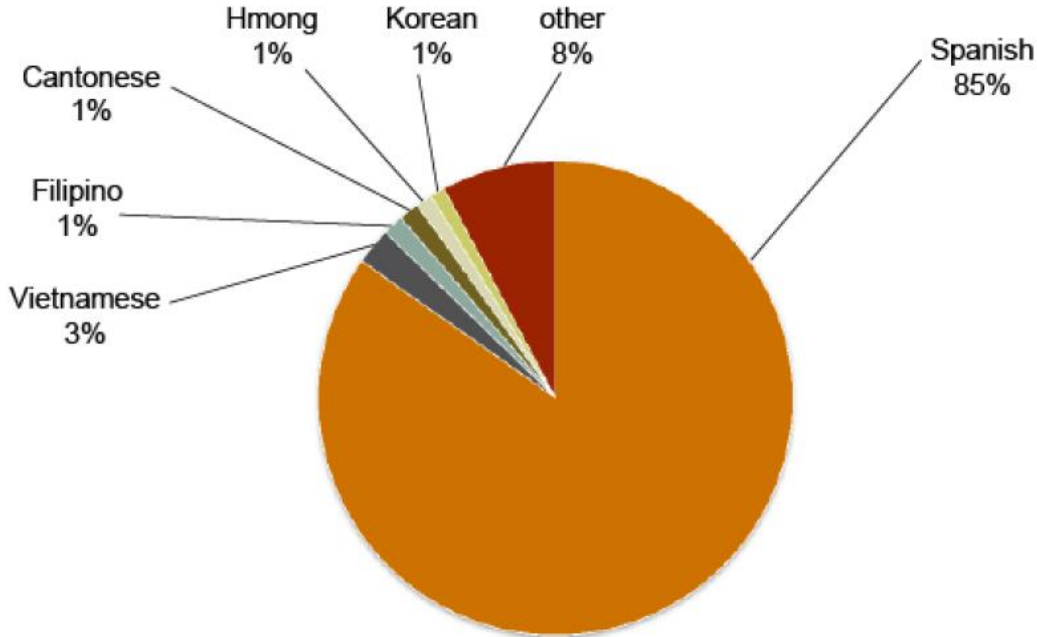
Percentage of English Learners (EL) in CA Collaborative Member Districts, 2016-17

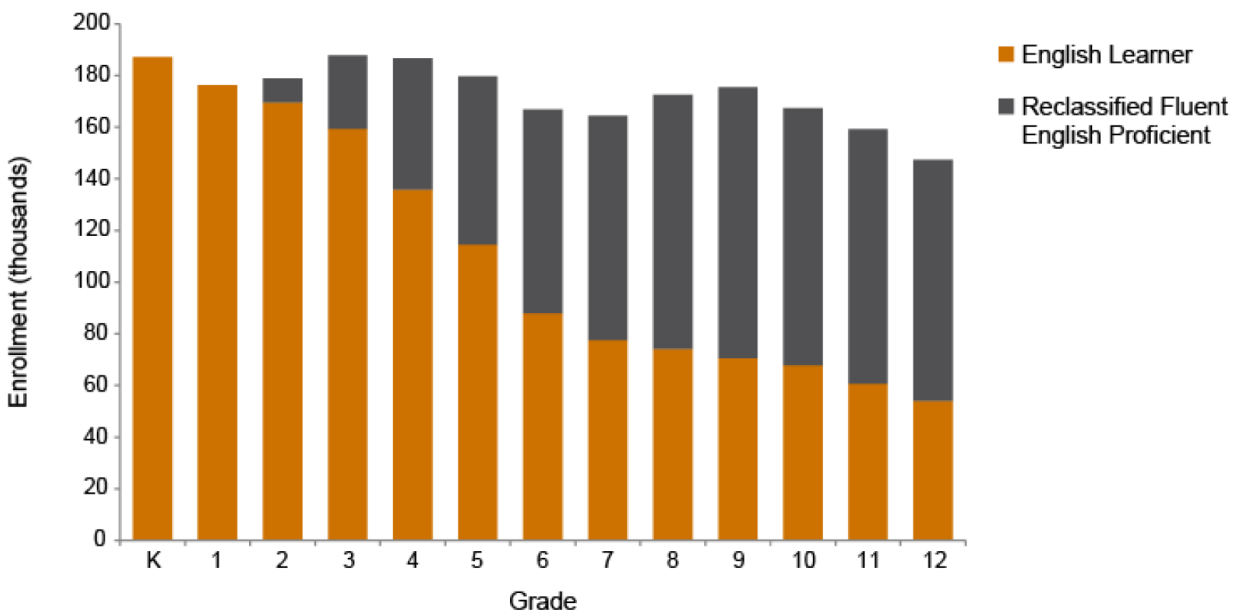

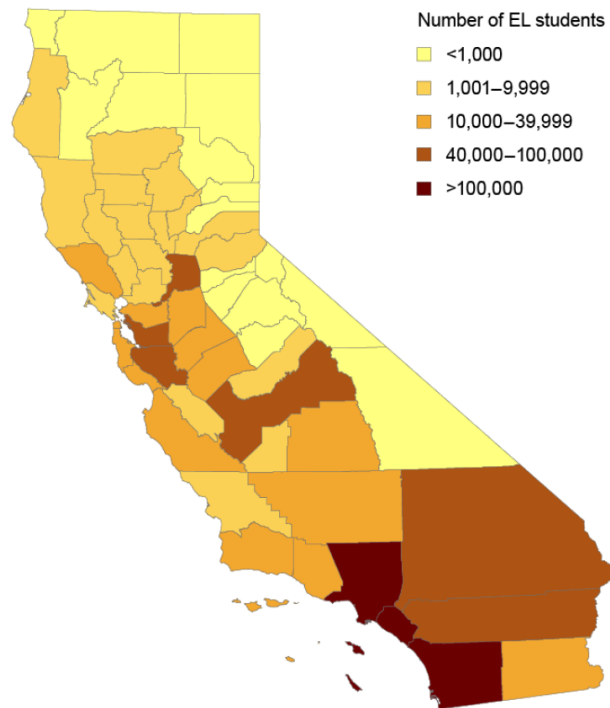
ELs and Reclassified Fluent English Proficient (RFEP) Students by Grade, 2010-11

 NOTES: PPIC used the number of EL and RFEP CST-takers for their counts for grades 1–11. This is the only available source for counts of RFEPs in state data, and EL counts do not match those from CALPADs exactly. For kindergarten, PPIC used the number of initial CELDT takers who did not meet the IFEP threshold, which likely overcounts them somewhat, especially when compared to the number of EL kindergartners from CALPADs in 2010–2011, which is missing grade and language detail for 415 districts, including LAUSD. CST results were not available for 12th grade. RFEPs were estimated from grade 11 RFEP test takers in the previous year.

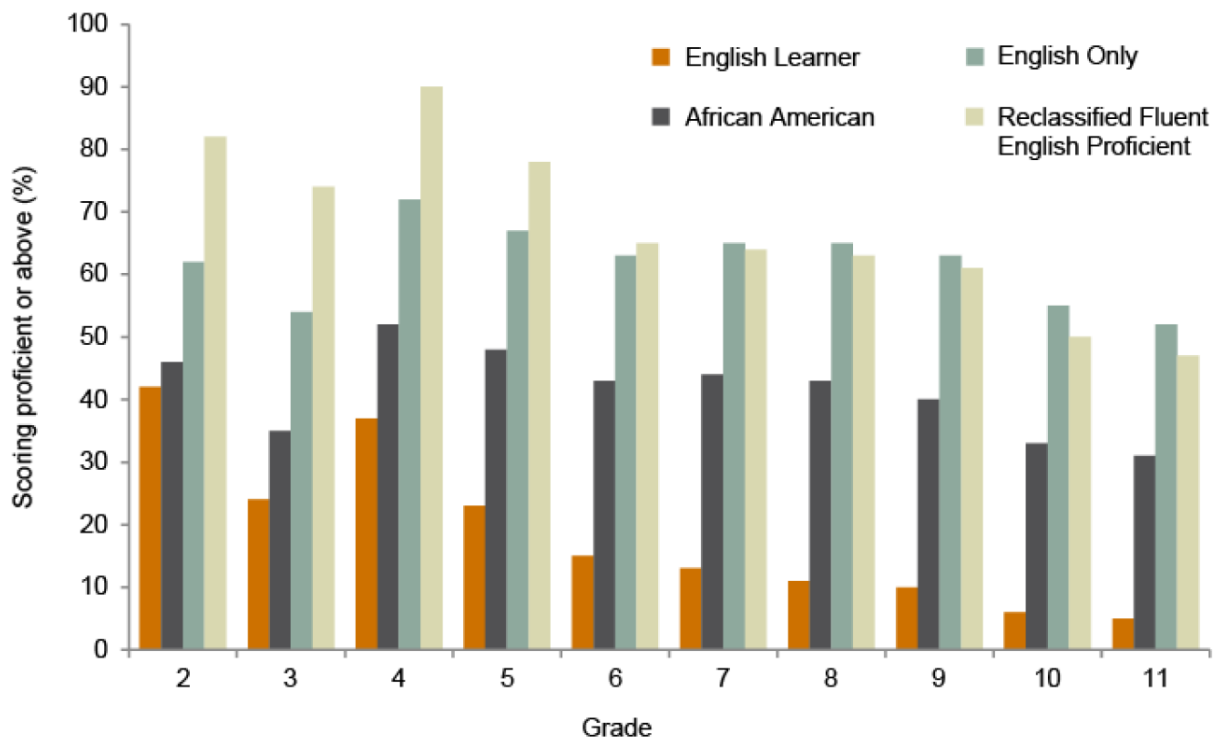
